

YOU'VE BEEN PRESCRIBED DOPTELET

WHAT'S NEXT?

Now that you're starting treatment with Doptelet, it's helpful to understand how you'll be receiving your medicine. Your doctor, insurance provider, and pharmacy will work with you to fill your Doptelet prescription.

Your prescription is sent to the pharmacy and insurance coverage is confirmed.

- Your doctor sends your Doptelet prescription to either a specialty pharmacy or clinic pharmacy.
- Your insurance provider may determine where your prescription is filled.
- If necessary, your doctor submits a prior authorization (PA)* to your health plan.
- You are notified if there are any out-of-pocket costs.

You need to answer a call from the pharmacy.

- The pharmacy calls you to confirm your order information and to let you know when you can expect Doptelet to be delivered.
- The call may come from an unknown or 800 number, but it's important to pick up the call. Not answering the call may delay the delivery of your medicine.
- If you miss the call, the pharmacy may leave a message. It's important to call them back as soon as possible.

Your doctor and pharmacy set up future refills.

- Remember to stay in touch with your doctor and pharmacy as you continue taking Doptelet.
- The pharmacy needs to speak to you to confirm each delivery.



LOOK OUT FOR A CALL

Doptelet cannot be delivered until the pharmacy has spoken to you to confirm your order.



Doptelet Connect™ offers access and reimbursement support to help patients access Doptelet. Doptelet Connect provides information regarding patient healthcare coverage options and financial assistance information that may be available to help patients with financial needs.

The Doptelet Copay Assistance Program is for eligible patients who have commercial prescription insurance. Patients may pay as little as \$0 per prescription, and may save up to a maximum of \$15,000 per calendar year.
